

## Topic Overview

In an overview you want to have equal distanced, equal formatted and equal aligned information. Also you want to have a very high information per character ratio.

Every break in this scheme destroys the readability:

- Fuzzy dates in text form are hard to fetch.  
(This is OK in the discussion board, but not in an overview.)
- The same is true for line breaks.

Only four points are of interest:

- Subject
- Original author
- Number of replies
- Date of last activity

The saved space should be used to get rid of the line breaks in topic and author.

The number of topic characters should be limited accordingly.

- The attachments are lost in the text.

Also the text width should be limited to something like 72 characters.
