I've set up redmine via docker, using <https://github.com/sameersbn/docker-redmine>. It doesn't have support for the incoming mail setup. I'll probably add an issue to that project also.

It seems like making the mail settings something that can be handled entirely within redmine is a better approach, at least for the IMAP/POP account based approach. Forwarding mail into Redmine obviously involves configuration beyond what can be done from within Redmine.
