Currently, tasks have labels for parent tasks which makes it somewhat traceable, but it can be quite a mess to try and identify the hierarchy from that list.</p> <p>I recommend adding some sort of tabbing or bulleting system for sub-tasks in the issues page.</p> |                                  |
