Subtasks of a task assigned to a specific target version should inherit that target version. Having said that: <ul style="list-style-type: none">- New subtasks should inherit their parent task's target version;- Changing target version to a parent task should propagate the change to all its subtasks;- Should not be possible to have a subtask with a target version different from its parent's.
